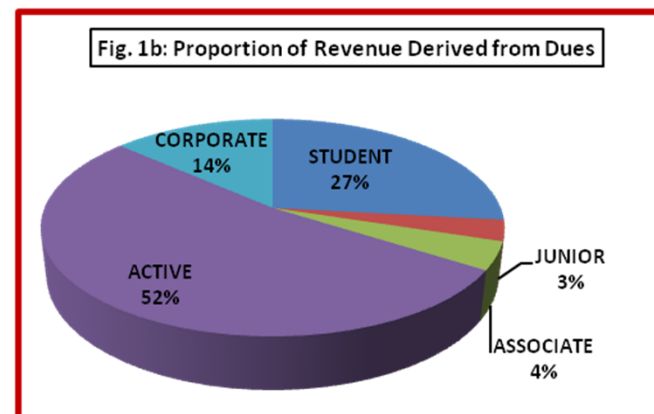
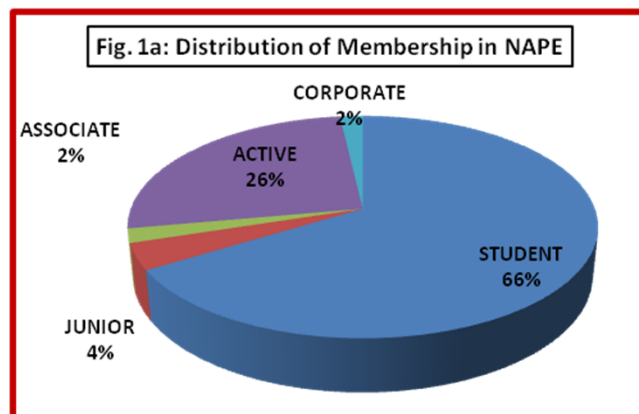

UNIVERSITY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

- **The University Assistance Programme (UAP) came into being after the establishment of the NAPE Foundation in 1987 and has the following objectives:**
 - To contribute to the continuous improvement of standards in geoscience education in Nigeria.
 - To encourage cross-fertilization of knowledge and ideas among Tertiary Institutions and the Oil/Mining Industries.
 - To create forum for academic interaction by organising scholarship and award programs.
 - To encourage publication in Geoscience books, journals and research funding.
 - To develop leaders with sound capabilities in the geosciences



LEADERSHIP FORUM

- **The NAPE-UAP Leadership Forum is held every other year alternately with the Mini-Conference and has the following features:**
 - It provides a platform for a broad spectrum of highly experienced geoscientists from tertiary institutions and the petroleum industry to deliberate on the state of geoscience education vis-à-vis expectations, challenges and opportunities in the energy and mining sectors
 - Speakers are drawn from the industry and the academia.
 - Subjects cover topical issues such as linkage of the academia with the industry and the challenges to advancement in the learning of the geosciences in tertiary institutions
 - Plausible solutions to imminent issues and challenges are examined and adopted as necessary



GRANT-in-AIDS
